Presentation to the City of Deer Park for the 2023 President's Award by Emergency Management Association of Texas (EMAT).

## Summary:

2023 continued to present challenges to Emergency Managers in Texas. January 24, 2023 was not an ordinary day. Heavy rains and thunders storms were tracking through Southeast Texas. At around 2:30 pm a EF3 tornado tracked across SE Harris County causing significant damage to homes, businesses and infrastructure. The Cities of Deer Park and Pasadena were impacted the most.

Both cities Emergency Management Offices coordinated with their departments to disseminate information through their notification and warning systems to alert the public. EOCs were activated and damage assessments began in the area.

Pasadena and Deer Park OEMs stayed in communication with each other to coordinate incoming resources and to communicate information that was consistent for the recovery operation. Working with local, state and federal partners damage assessments were conducted and a Disaster Assistance Center stood up withing three days to begin assisting residents in need. Debris operations began and unprecedented mutual aid was provided by other adjoining cities to assist in picking up debris and taking to temporary debris storage sites in Deer Park. Although no federal assistance was granted for IA or PA the cities continued to work with agencies and an SBA declaration was declared.

The cities continue to recover as homes have been rebuilt and business continue to open. This response is a great example of the importance of knowing your partners in advance and setting common priorities, goals and objectives to meet their community needs in a disaster.

## Summary:

Sodium Orthophosphate is the corrosion inhibitor used in the water system to create scaling on the pipes and prevent the leaching of metals into the water. The water system recently moved to sodium orthophosphate as a result of the Lead and Copper Rule Revision.

Seven (7) bidders submitted information on their products for our use. Two (2) of the bidders were disqualified: one for pricing a phosphate salt instead of a liquid in a tote as instructed in the bid and one for offering sodium polyphosphate which is not seen as equal in the bid request. The remaining five (5) vendors had pricing as follows:

CALL TO ORDER – Mayor Mouton called the workshop to order at 6:15 p.m.

COMMENTS FROM AUDIENCE – No comments received.

DISCUSSION OF ISSUES RELATING TO THE INVESTMENT GRADE AUDIT (IGA) 1. PERFORMED BY PERFORMANCE SERVICES, INC. FOR THE ADVANCED METERING INFRASTRUCTURE (AMI) PROJECT - Assistant City Manager Sara Robinson addressed Council regarding the AMI project that is being funded by ARPA money. The city went through a long process of proposals and brought in Performance Services Inc., (PSI) as a part of the proposal to perform an investment grade audit. Once the audit was complete, it was discovered that a handful of accounts had meters located in the backyard of the property. In order to facilitate the completion of the project, each one of those meters must be relocated to the front of the property. A quote for each meter was created separately as part of the audit to replace the lines. Roughly, there are between 150 - 250 meters that have to be relocated at a total price of \$1.5 - \$1.6 million (to not exceed price). A third-party plumbing company hired to work on this project walked every home and are comfortable with their quote. The city has \$8.2 million set aside for the AMI project but anything above and beyond that amount will come from cash reserves. There is an action item later in the meeting to approve the first amendment to the contract with PSI. One option that could have occurred was to ask the residents to pay for the relocation of the lines but this was not truly an option that mayor and staff wanted so the city will use cash reserves to pay for the relocation of the lines.

This is not the infrastructure of the water lines but the lines from the back of the property to the front of the property and is just located in a small older part of town (east & west of center street), per Public Works Engineering Inspector George Gonzalez. Mr. Gonzalez explained that the water line is routed from the easement at the rear of the property and needs to be moved to the front of property now and re-pipe from where the service line enters the home and will bore under concrete. It will be a case-by-case basis on all of them. Just a note, it is not the main water line but the connections of the water meters that are moving from back to front.

Ms. Robinson commented that this is something that always needed to be addressed and eventually would have been addressed, we are just taking advantage of the water meter project to complete it.

Greg Smith with Performance Services Inc (PSI) added that the plan is to have all the needed concrete work completed at the same time the meters are installed to avoid prolonger, if any, disruptions to the home owners. He also mentioned that the supply of 7,000 out of 12,000 meters are on site and ready to be installed. It was mentioned that the replacement project will start in the northeast part of Deer Park toward the end of this month.

- 2. <u>DISCUSSION OF ISSUES RELATING TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 BUDGET CALENDAR</u> Assistant City Manager Sara Robinson advised Council of the calendar that includes budget related workshops, meetings and hearings for the City staff, City Council, the CCPD Board, the FCPEMSD Board, and the Deer Park Community Development Corporation Board. (A1). The June 24<sup>th</sup> workshop is the only special called meeting.
- 3. <u>DISCUSSION OF ISSUES RELATING TO THE QUARTERLY FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 FIRST QUARTER ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2023</u> Finance Director Nicole Gainey gave a summary of the preliminary and unaudited results for the fiscal year October 2023 December 2023. Ms. Gainey mentioned that the sales tax is consistent with last year with the expectation of a flat sales tax potential for this year.
- 4. <u>DISCUSSION OF ISSUES RELATED TO POTENTIAL SIGNAGE ON OUTFIELD FENCES AT CITY FACILITIES</u> City Manager Stokes gave an overview of the large number of requests to advertise at City facilities. The requests come mainly from businesses that would like to hang banners on the fences of athletic complexes. The city has never allowed such advertising except for signs and banners of the sports organization sponsorship partners. Mr. Stokes spoke of the suggestion to discuss a solution that may benefit the city pertaining to potential revenue but also the down side of not being in control to regulate the verbiage or subjects on the signs/banners.

Parks and Recreation Director Charlie Sandberg asked for guidance within a policy to be able to follow and implement.

City Attorney Jim Fox added that from a legal standpoint, the city should not and could not impose any restrictions on the "freedom of speech" of any advertisement. Mr. Fox expressed his concerns of the legalities the city will have to adhere pertaining to the content of the signs/banners.

After a lengthy discussion, the City Council agreed that if the city allows banners/signage from businesses, it may bring more problems than benefits to the city.

- 5. <u>DISCUSSION OF ISSUES RELATING TO THE LEASE AND ACQUISITION OF GOLF CARTS FOR THE BATTLEGROUND GOLF COURSE</u> Parks and Recreation Director Charlie Sandberg spoke of the current discussions to renew the lease and trade out the current fleet of golf carts for updated models. Quotes have been obtained a new lease for 48-months for 80 lithium battery EzGo Golf carts.. The total annual cost of the golf carts is estimated at \$135,916.80.
- 6. <u>DISCUSSION OF PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF STATIONARY FLOCK SAFETY LICENSE PLATE READER CAMERAS</u> Assistant Chief of Police Frank Hart gave an overview of the free access to the Flock camera system given to the Police Department about a year ago while waiting on the completion of the new EOC/Dispatch Center. On February 1, 2024, it was confirmed that the free access will expire April 1, 2024. Flock access has been a very valuable tool for officers. It has been requested to purchase and install the camera system from the CCPD funds in the amount of \$29,200.

### Summary:

The City of Deer Park, Texas is a member of a coalition of political subdivisions in the Greater Houston area known as the Gulf Coast Coalition of Cities ("GCCC"). GCCC has been in existence since the early 1990s. The GCCC represents the interests of its members on gas and electric utility matters before the Public Utility Commission of Texas, the Railroad Commission of Texas, the Electric Reliability Council of Texas, and the courts. For the past 20 years, GCCC has protected the authority of municipalities over monopoly electric and natural gas providers and has defended the interests of the residential and small commercial customers within the cities. Cities are often the only consumer advocates that work to keep utility rates reasonable. The work undertaken by GCCC has saved ratepayers millions of dollars in unreasonable charges. GCCC has previously approved the hiring of Lloyd Gosselink Rochelle & Townsend, P.C. and consultants to intervene in matters related to the electric utility rate case filings, representing GCCC members' interests.

CenterPoint Energy Houston Electric, LLC ("CenterPoint" or "Company") filed an application on March 6, 2024 with cities retaining original jurisdiction seeking to increase system-wide transmission and distribution rates by \$60 million per year. The Company asks the City to approve an increase of \$17 million in retail transmission and distribution rates (an increase of about 1%) and \$43 million in wholesale transmission rates (an increase of about 6.6%). According to CenterPoint, the impact on an average residential customer would be an increase of about \$1.25 per month.

### From the Resolution to be passed:

The City is authorized to suspend the rate change for 90 days after the date that the rate

change would otherwise be effective for any legitimate purpose. Time to study and investigate the application is always a legitimate purpose. Please note that the resolution refers to the suspension period as "the maximum period allowed by law" rather than ending by a specific date. This is because the Company controls the effective date and can extend the deadline for final city action to increase the time that the City retains jurisdiction if necessary to reach settlement on the case. If the suspension period is not otherwise extended by the Company, the City must take final action on CenterPoint's request to raise rates by April 10, 2024.

This provision authorizes the City to participate in a coalition of cities served by CenterPoint, GCCC, in order to more efficiently represent the interests of the City and their citizens.

The Company will reimburse the cities for their reasonable rate case expenses. Legal counsel and consultants approved by GCCC cities will submit monthly invoices that will be forwarded to CenterPoint for reimbursement. No individual city incurs liability for payment of rate case expenses by adopting a suspension resolution.

During the December 5th, 2023 City Council Workshop, City staff presented on the status on the search for a vendor to assist with Christmas décor around the City of Deer Park. Committee members and staff engaged with several potential vendors and reviewed numerous options. Dekra-Lite, a nationally recognized company, that provides custom decoration and light displays to numerous organizations around the United States presented to City Council an overview of the level of services that they could provide. They also provided information on a potential decoration and maintenance plan for Christmas decorations for the City of Deer Park. City of Deer Park staff was then directed to discuss further with Dekra-Lite the details pertaining to the proposed decorations and maintenance plan. In addition, Dekra-Lite was asked to present and determine a cost for the services to be considered.

Dekra-Lite has provided the City of Deer Park with the requested information and presented to City Council on February 20, 2024 the cost estimate, items to be included, and explained the level of service that the City of Deer Park would receive. Staff has met with Derka-lite and is now ready to proceed with a recommendation for approval of the purchase of Christmas light services.

The annual cost per year would be \$149,908.36 and would include the following items:

- Custom light décor package for 30'RGB tree w specialty ornaments

- Custom "Tex" Deer

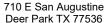

The audit firm of Belt Harris Pechacek, LLLP performed the annual audit for the City and determined that "the financial statements...present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of...the City as of September 30, 2023... in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America" (unmodified opinion). The auditors will present the results of the audit and their findings to the City Council.

Additionally, because the City expended more than \$750,000 in federal awards during the most recent fiscal year, a single audit was required for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2023 in accordance with the provisions of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards.

Staff is waiting to receive the final documents from the auditors which includes the covers and signatures. All documents are marked as "draft" at this time; however, no significant changes are expected.

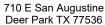

In July of 2020, the City of Deer Park entered into an agreement with PNC with a 48 Month Lease for 80 Golf Carts as part of an agreement with Touchstone Golf to manage the Battleground Golf course. The lease is in its final year and slated to end in July of 2024. The City and Touchstone have now begun discussions to renew the lease and trade out the current fleet of golf carts for updated models. ### Summary:

During the December 5th, 2023 City Council Workshop, City staff presented on the status on the search for a vendor to assist with Christmas décor around the City of Deer Park. Committee members and staff engaged with several potential vendors and reviewed numerous options. Obligation under this warranty is limited to repairing or replacing any part that is found to be defective.

LED Light strands have a warranty for three (3) 60 day seasons or 25,000 hours, whichever comes first. Simply ship the product to us and we will replace the LED Light strand free of charge.

Frame Trees are covered by a ten (10) year warranty against defect under normal conditions and use.

All items not specifically listed are covered by a one (1) season (60 day) warranty.

Under this warranty, the company's obligation to repair or replace is on a non pro-rated basis.

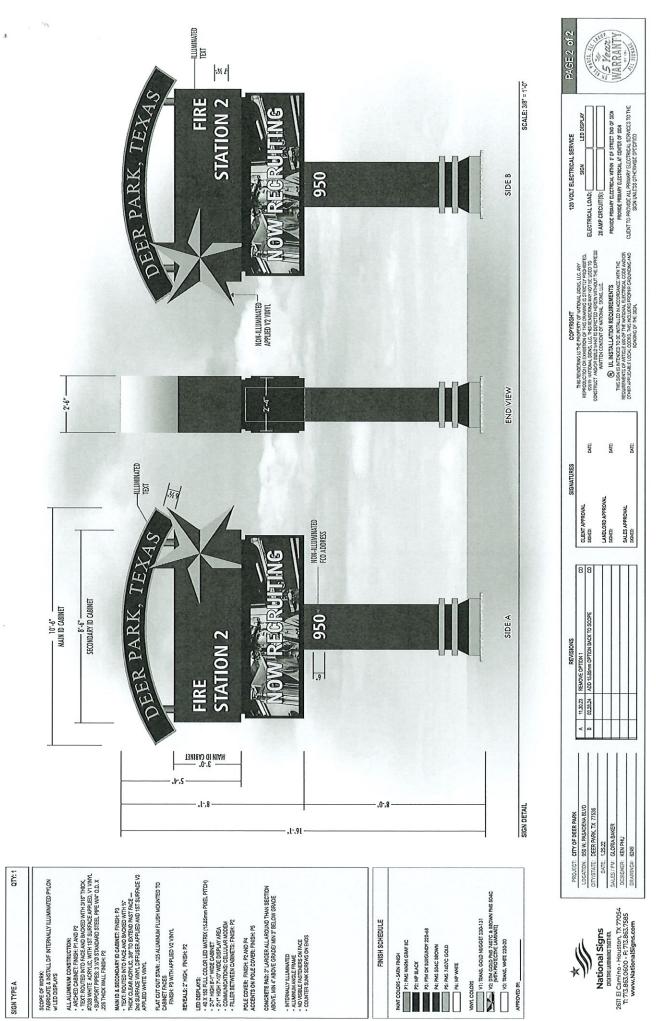

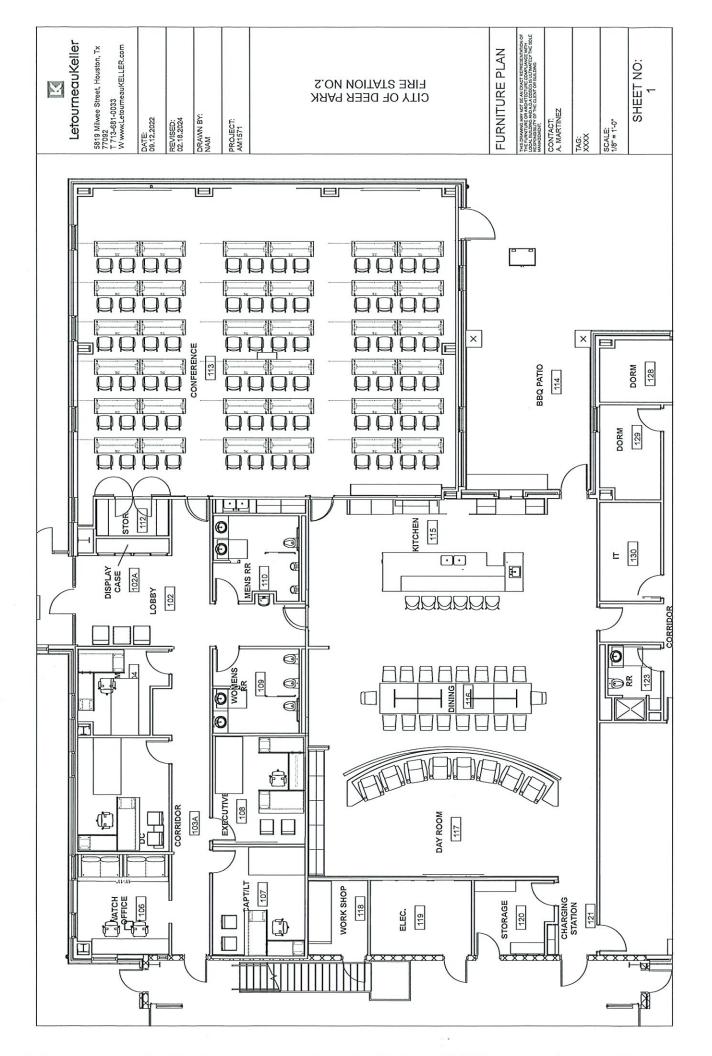

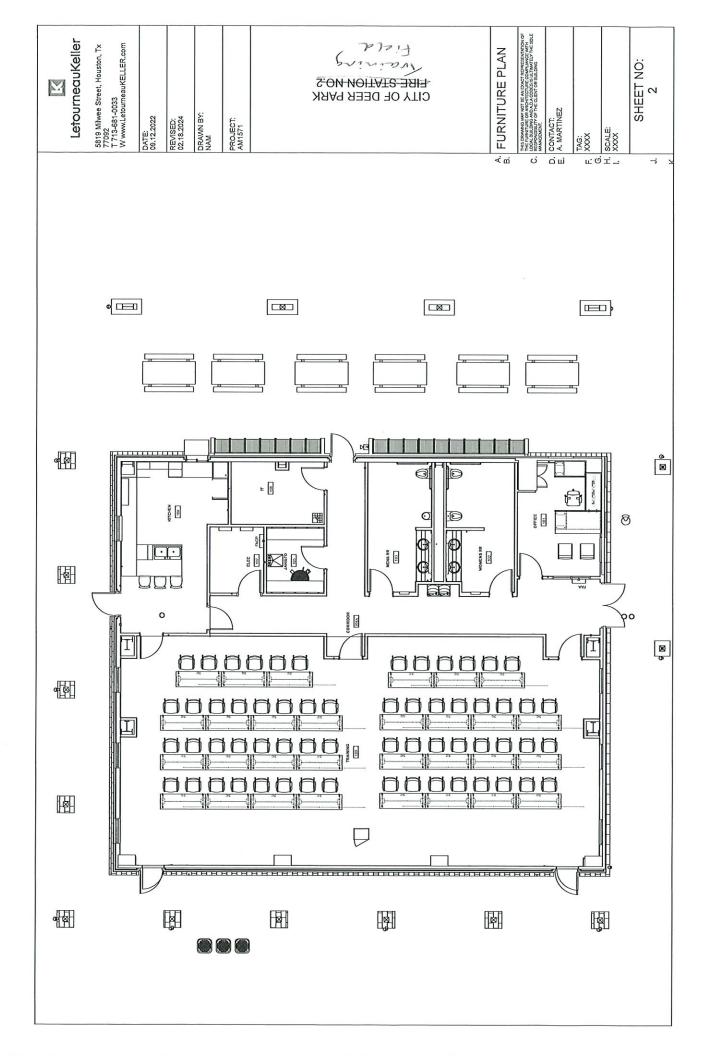
