- 2. <u>COMMENTS FROM AUDIENCE</u> No comments received.
- 3. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING ON JANUARY 27, 2020</u> Motion was made by Doug Burgess and seconded by Laura Hicks to approve the minutes of regular meeting held on January 27, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.
- <u>CONSIDERATION OF AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON THE QUARTERLY REPORT FOR</u> <u>THE PERIOD OF JANUARY 1, 2020 - MARCH 31, 2020</u> – Motion was made by Eric Ripley and seconded by Jeff Lawther to approve the quarterly report for the period of January 1, 2020 - March 31, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

 <u>DISCUSSION OF ISSUES RELATING TO THE STATUS OF DPCDC PROJECTS FOR</u> <u>THE PERIOD OF JANUARY 2020 - MARCH 2020</u> – Parks and Recreation Director Charlie Sandberg gave an overview of the projects to include Dow Park Pavilion, Girls Softball and Soccer Complex, Community Center, Hike and Bike Trails, and Spencerview Athletic Complex. (Exhibit A1-A4)

President Georgette Ford asked, "Are there plans to put the Community Center on the November 3, 2020 ballot?"

Assistant City Manager Gary Jackson responded, "The election was rescheduled to November 3, 2020 and the Community Center is currently on the ballot."

Jeff Lawther asked, "If the election doesn't pass, would we just have additional money we can't spend?"

Mr. Jackson responded, "We would be able to pay off bond debt earlier."

Ms. Ford asked, "If it is open ended, can that money be spent on anything or does the verbiage have to be put in there a specific way since this money is from before?"

Mr. Jackson responded, "Anything that is in the ballot that the voters approve, can be spent."

6. <u>DISCUSSION OF ISSUES RELATING TO THE PRELIMINARY FY 2020-2021 DPCDC</u> <u>BUDGET</u> – Finance Director Donna Todd gave an overview of the preliminary FY 2020-2021 DPCDC Budget to include the total revenues of \$2,702,500, that represent estimated sales tax revenue and investment earnings. These estimates are based on anticipated revenue reductions resulting from the economic impact of COVID-19. March sales tax collections reflect the beginning of the pandemic effect and were down 9.7 percent from February. It is completely unknown how the COVID-19 will impact the new fiscal year. (B1-B6)

Ms. Todd commented, "Along with a list of projects that were approved, the funding sources which are 18 million dollars of debt and 2 million dollars of "pay as you go" and the allocation of the 20 million by project. The way this was written with the original voter approved language is why you can't, as Mr. Jackson has explained, take these extra earnings and do any additional projects because the voters were very specific in how this was done by project."

Deer Park CDC Project Update

April 2020 – June 2020

Dow Park Pavilion Project - This project was identified as one of seven approved projects in the 2015 Type B dedicated sales tax election that was voted for by Deer Park residents. The City entered into a contract with Halff Associates as the architect and South Pool and Spa as the general contractor. The project is funded with \$1.5 million from Type B sales tax. The new restroom buildings were installed and progress continues on the pavilion structures. The City terminated the contract with the previous general contractor and awarded a contract for the completion of the project to Mills Construction. The project was completed in September of 2018.

• COVID-19 Pandemic has pushed the Court Date between the City and the South Pool and Spa to a later time

Maxwell Adult Center - This project was one of seven approved projects in the 2015 Type B dedicated sales tax election that was voted for by Deer Park residents. The project is funded with \$2 million from Type B sales tax. The City of Deer Park selected Halff Associates as the architect and Frost Construction as the general contractor for the project. Construction began in November of 2017. Demo of the interior and site preparation for the new addition has been completed. The project is complete.

- Project dedication plaque installed and in the building.
- Maxwell Adult Center Canopy installation was completed.

Girls Softball Complex - This project was identified as one of seven approved projects in the 2015 Type B dedicated sales tax election that was voted for by Deer Park residents. This project is funded by \$3 million from Type B sales tax. The City selected Tandem Services as the general contractor and Halff Associates as the architect for this project. Construction began in January 2018. The project was completed on August 20, 2019. Currently, evaluating options for the addition of future parking at the complex.

- Staff has been working with Tandem and Halff on an Irrigation Issue

Deer Park Soccer Complex - This project is another one of the seven approved projects in the 2015 Type B dedicated sales tax election. The project is being funded with \$4 million from Type B sales tax. The City of Deer Park selected Halff Associates as the architect and Tandem Services as the general contractor. Construction began in January 2018. The project was completed on February 4, 2020.

- Currently evaluating options for the addition of future parking at the complex.
- Staff working with Tandem and Halff with an electrical issue
- Staff working with Tandem and Halff with an Irrigation Issue

Community Center – This project is another one of the seven approved projects in the 2015 Type B dedicated sales tax election. The project is being funded with \$6 million from Type B sales tax. This project is currently under staff review and discussion.

- City of Deer Park has hired Brinkley, Sargent, Wigington has architectural firm for consulting and design of the potential renovations and expansion of the Deer Park Community Center.
- City staff visited 5 Houston area recreation centers to begin researching facility design and trends.

- Enter into agreement with Burditt Consultants, LLC. for professional services for the development of the Type B Hike and Bike trails.

- May 16 Meeting with Harris County Flood Control District to discuss potential Hike and Bike trail access.
- July 10 Committee meeting to discuss the Hike and Bike trails project and several phase options during the design.
- September 11 Committee meeting to discuss the finalization of the final design for the conceptual Hike and Bike Trail plan.
- Construction plans are currently at 30% completed.
- Staff has submitted an application to Center Point Energy for access through an energy easement.
- Staff is anticipating completing the design in the fall of 2020.
- Staff has entered into an Agreement with Midtown Engineering to develop a concept for safety in crossing a street that is part of Trail design. This study will take approximately one month to complete.

Spencerview Athletic Complex - This project is another one of the seven approved projects in the 2015 Type B dedicated sales tax election. The project is being funded with \$3 million from Type B sales tax.

- This project was completed in August of 2017 and is currently in use.
- Ongoing discussions with Harris County Flood Control on Spencer view Bridge project
- City staff currently working with HCFCD on the Spencer view Bridge access and design.
- City staff has contracted with Cobb Findley to assist with easement issues related to the access and design of the Spencer view Bridge.
- City Staff with the Cobb Fendley Agreement will gain data to present the Harris County Flood Control District to install a Bridge across the Spencer view Complex into park property. The data received will be structural design and detail of abutment substructure, civil design for approach trails, preparation of construction documents, project management, geotechnical report with borings and testing.

Summary:

The DPCDC bylaws provide that the Corporation's fiscal year shall be the same as the fiscal year of the City, which is October 1 - September 30. A preliminary budget for the DPCDC for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 was presented for discussion at the May 26, 2020 Board meeting.

The City Council is scheduled to adopt the DPCDC budget at the August 18, 2020 City Council meeting (note: the final Fiscal Year 2020-2021 City Budget, which incorporates all funds and component units of the City, is scheduled for adoption on September 15, 2020).

This item is for the Board of Directors to consider and take action on approving the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Deer Park Community Development Corporation Budget. The final proposed budget did not change from the preliminary budget presented and discussed at the May 26, 2020 Board meeting. The final proposed Fiscal Year 2020-2021 budget for the DPCDC includes total revenues of \$2,702,500 (tax revenue and investment revenue) and total expenditures of \$1,909,430 (services, supplies, and operating transfers to the City). The operating transfers are primarily to pay for the debt service costs on the bonds funding the approved Type B capital projects, including estimated issuance and debt service costs for the final debt issuance of \$5,850,000 planned in 2021. These transfers also include pay-as-you-go funding for approved capital projects.

Fiscal/Budgetary Impact:

The proposed budget includes all anticipated revenues to be derived in Fiscal Year 2020-2021 from

the ½% Type B sales and use tax and all proposed expenditures for the fiscal year.

Approve the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Budget and submit to City Council.

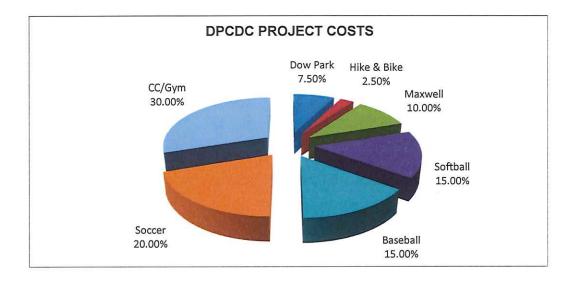
