- 1. <u>MEETING CALLED TO ORDER</u> President Burke called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m.
- 2. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> Motion was made by Dianna Taylor and seconded by Bob Hotten to approve the minutes of the special meeting on December 12, 2016. Motion carried unanimously.
- 3. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> Motion was made by Dianna Taylor and seconded by Bob Hotten to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on October 17, 2016. Motion carried unanimously.
- 4. PRESENTATION OF THE QUARTERLY FINANCIAL REPORT FOR FY 2016-2017 FIRST QUARTER ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2016 Acting Treasurer Donna Todd presented the Financial Report (Exhibit A1- A2).

Motion was made by George Pinder and seconded by Dianna Taylor to accept the Financial Report as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

5. <u>DISCUSSION OF FY 16 CCPD ACCOUNT OF DISBURSEMENT OF DISTRICT REPORT</u> – Acting Treasurer Donna Todd advised the Board of Chapter 363. Crime Control and Prevention Districts includes Sec. 363.207, "Account of Disbursements of District." This provision states: "Not later than the 60th day after the last day of each fiscal year, an administrator shall prepare for the Board a sworn statement of the amount of money that belongs to the district and an account of the disbursements of that money.

"We usually email this report every year, but we decided to add it to the agenda just in case someone had a question. Basically, we are satisfying a reporting requirement each year."

1. CONSIDERATION OF AND ACTION ON A QUARTERLY PLAN FOR EXPENDITURES FOR THE PERIOD OF JANUARY 1, 2017 THROUGH MARCH 31, 2017 - Captain Wade Conner advised the Board the expenditure plan is basically the same report from the first quarter. We made some expenditures out of it. I want to draw your attention to OSSI licensing fees. "We had \$74,650 budgeted. They invoiced us \$42,955.28. The Watchguard in-car video systems, we had \$51,409 budgeted and they only invoiced \$29,840. We saved some money. These items will keep going into the each quarter until we purchase them all." Motion was made by Bob Hotten and seconded by Graig O'Sullivan to accept the expenditures for the period of January 1, 2017 through March 31, 2017. Motion carried unanimously.

2. CONSIDERATION OF AND ACTION ON AUTHORIZING A CHANGE ORDER FOR ADDITIONAL EARTHWORK FOR THE BERMS AT THE POLICE FIRING RANGE AND TRAINING FACILITY – Captain Wade Conner, commented, "In the process of constructing the berms for the firing range, it was discovered that there was not enough soil to complete the work within the scope indicated by G2 Architects. It is believed that there is enough soil on the property that is usable soil for the berms, but the remaining dirt lies outside the boundaries of the scope of work on the property. It is indicated that 2,835 cubic yards of soil are needed to complete the berms and this dirt will be moved from outside the boundaries of the scope. The cost of this work still remains below the contingent amount of \$100,000 already agreed on in contract by the City Council and Crime Control Prevention District Board. The total amount of the change order is \$57,039.78."

Motion was made by George Pinder and seconded by Bob Hotten to approve the change order for additional earthwork for the berms at the Police Firing Range and Training Facility. Motion carried unanimously.

3. <u>ADJOURN</u> - President Burke adjourned the meeting at 5:32 p.m.
