- 1. <u>MEETING CALLED TO ORDER</u> President Craig O'Sullivan called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m.
- 2. <u>COMMENTS FROM AUDIENCE</u> No comments received.
- 3. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING ON OCTOBER 14, 2019</u> Motion was made by Dianna Taylor and seconded by Bob Hotten to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on October 14, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.
- 4. <u>INTRODUCTION OF NEW MEMBER OF THE CCPD BOARD OF DIRECTORS</u> President O'Sullivan introduced the newest member Floyd Harvey, and welcomed him to the Board.
- 5. PRESENTATION OF THE QUARTERLY FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE FY 2019-2020 FIRST QUARTER ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2019 Treasurer, Donna Todd gave an overview of the first preliminary and unaudited quarterly financial report detailing the revenues and expenditures for the District's FY 2019-2020 first quarter ended December 31, 2019. (Exhibit A1)

Motion was made by Dianna Taylor and seconded by Floyd Harvey to accept the Quarterly Financial Report for the FY 2019-2020 First Quarter ended December 31, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.

- 6. CONSIDERATION OF AND ACTION ON A QUARTERLY PLAN FOR EXPENDITURES FOR THE PERIOD OF JANUARY 1, 2020 THROUGH MARCH 31, 2020 Captain Wade Conner gave an overview of the main purchases for the period and also gave the Board an update of the repairs being done to the berms. Captain Conner updated the Board on the fiber route protection for the RMS/CAD emphasizing that the work has started, the building automation system is moving a little slower than expected but still in progress, the Tahoes have all been purchased and are currently being equipped for use, along with the AR-15 rifles that are being equipped out for tactical purposes. - 7. UPDATE ON THE REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS (RFQ) FOR ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES FOR PROGRAMMING AND MASTER PLANNING OF THE NEW EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER Assistant City Manager Gary Jackson gave an overview of the process on the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Architectural Services for Programming and Master Planning of the new Emergency Operations Center budgeted in the FY 2019-2020 CCPD Budget that would include the conceptual design of a new Emergency Operations Center at the Police Department. Five (5) interested vendors sent in Statements of Qualifications (SOQs) and a selection committee was appointed to score and rank the vendors based upon the evaluation criteria in accordance with the RFQ. PGAL, ranked the highest among the vendors, will be notified and a submission for a proposed contract with fees will be requested. This will be limited to the conceptual design only and not building plans.

Board member Donald Zuckero asked, "Will this be for a separate building or would it be part of the Police Station?"

Mr. Jackson responded, "It will be sort of an annex to the Police Department. The EOC is in the front of the building and this would relocate it to a different part of the building. Dispatch will also be relocated as well, so it will a combined operation of about 7,500 feet which is what the concept was for an additional footprint."

Board member Dianna Taylor asked, "Does this detention pond that is there now, will it be able to take care of any addition that we have?"

Mr. Jackson responded, "The City Engineer and Public Works Director indicated that it was sized for expansion when the detention pond was built. It may potentially have to be dug a little deeper but it is a pumped facility. It will have the capacity, but it may have to be dug a little deeper but not wider."

President O'Sullivan commented, "It sounds like you got a lot of great folks looking at this. I just want to make we get it right because this should last us a long time. We have to make sure where we spend our money in good faith to getting it correct. It's probably going to cost us a lot of money and while we got the money, I just want to make sure we get it correct. I appreciate the hard work and let's make sure we are working with the architects to get the design right and we will work on funding the rest of it when it's time."

December 31, 2019

Authority for the Deer Park Crime Control Prevention District is provided by Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 363. The purpose of the District is to enhance the capability of law enforcement and further crime prevention programs in the City of Deer Park. The fund was established by a dedicated one-fourth of one percent (0.25%) sales and use tax approved by the voters in May 2011 and effective on October 1, 2011 for a period of five years. In May 2016, voters authorized continuation of the District, including the dedicated 0.25% sales and use tax, for an additional period of 10 years.
